

EXHIBITIONS AND AWARDS

Academic and Music Exhibitions worth less than half fees may be awarded at the school's discretion.

13+ Art Award – candidates are required to submit a portfolio of work and sit a two hour practical examination.

13+ Drama Award – candidates must demonstrate their potential through audition and improvisation

The Old Girls' Lantern Exhibition for Art, endowed by the Old Girls' Association and worth £350 per annum for two years, is awarded to a suitably qualified entrant to the **Sixth Form**. Candidates will submit a portfolio of work

The Friends and Parents' Award is a single payment of £500. It is given to the Junior School girl proceeding to the Senior School who gains the highest marks in the eleven-plus scholarship examination, provided she has not been awarded a Scholarship.

Candidates for all awards, exhibitions and scholarships must satisfy the school's academic entrance requirements. Internal candidates may apply.

SCHOLARSHIPS

ACADEMIC

Open Foundation Scholarships, worth up to half fees, are awarded at **age eleven** to the girls who show the greatest academic potential in the school's own examination.

Open Foundation Scholarships, worth up to half fees, are awarded at **age thirteen** to the girls who show the greatest academic potential in the school's own examination.

MUSIC

Music Scholarships, worth up to half fees, are awarded annually at **age eleven**.

Music Scholarships, worth up to half fees, are also awarded annually at **age thirteen**.

Music Scholarships are awarded on the basis of performance in audition.

SPORTS

Sports Scholarships, worth up to 25% of fees are awarded annually at **age eleven**.

Sports Scholarships, worth up to 25% of fees are awarded annually at **age thirteen**.

ACADEMIC continued

Open Sixth Form Scholarships, worth up to half fees, are awarded to the girls who show the greatest academic potential and perform well in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination held during the Autumn Term each year.

The Erasmus Scholarship for Humanities and Languages is awarded to a girl who intends to study Humanities and/or Languages in the **Sixth Form** and who shows the greatest academic potential in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination.

The Darwin Scholarship for Sciences is awarded to a girl who intends to study Sciences in the **Sixth Form** and who shows the greatest academic potential in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination.

The Tanner Award for Mathematics is awarded to a girl who intends to study Mathematics in the **Sixth Form** and who shows the greatest academic potential in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination.

The Diana Burn Rosen Award for Chemistry or for Languages awarded to a girl who intends to study either Chemistry or Languages in the **Sixth Form** and who shows potential in either of these fields in the Sixth Form Scholarship Examination.

BURSARIES

The **Bursary Fund** is designed to ensure that girls are not prevented from benefiting from or continuing with an education at Walthamstow Hall because of their family's financial circumstances.

In addition, the school offers a limited number of **Founders' Bursaries** which cover nearly 100% of tuition fees and are awarded at either 11+ or 13+ to girls whose family, financial and personal circumstances are such that without this bursary an independent education could not be considered.

Bursaries are awarded by Governors and the names of the girls in receipt of them remain confidential. The school's academic entrance requirements must be fulfilled.

Generous allowances are made where parents have more than one daughter at the school.

Parents and their daughters are always welcome to visit the school to discuss these awards and the school's entrance procedure with Headmistress, Mrs Jill Milner.
